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INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the practitioner level to assess whether the candidate can demonstrate sufficient ability to apply and tailor the PRINCE2 project management method to be awarded the PRINCE2 Practitioner qualification. A successful Practitioner candidate should, with suitable direction, be able to start applying the method to a real project but may not be sufficiently skilled to do this appropriately for all situations. Their individual project management expertise, complexity of the project and the support provided for the use of PRINCE2 in their work environment will all be factors that impact what the Practitioner can achieve.

ASSOCIATED EXAMS AND CERTIFICATION
